Seat for Forklifts - A seat is a sturdy, sturdy surface to sit down, usually raised above floor level. Typically used by a single individual, nearly all seats are supported by four legs, though a few may be in a triangular shape utilizing just three legs. A stool is a kind of seat that does not have any arm rests or a back rest. A seat that has folding action and an inclining footrest is referred to as a recliner, while a seat along with arms only is considered an arm seat. When a seat has connected wheels, it could be known as a wheelseat and if the seat is hung from above, it is known as a swing. A permanently attached seat in a theatre or a train is referred to as a seat or airline seat, yet when riding; it is a saddle as in bicycle saddle. A car seat is the type used within automobiles and an infant car seat would be a kind of seat specially intended for little children.

The design of the seat could differ rather significantly so as to accommodate many aesthetic tastes and requirements. As an example, designs could be decorated with drilled openings, could include low backs or gaps for ventilation or be made of porous materials. The seat back could be designed as an included headrest by extending the height above the occupant's head. Seats may be made together with an attached, built in footrest or come with a separate matching ottoman. An ottoman is a short stool which is intended to be used as a movable footrest. Sometimes the ottoman could be mounted to a glider chair with swing arms, permitting the ottoman to rock back and forth along with the glider similar to a rocking chair together with a built-in footrest.

Covers meant for seats are temporary fabric wraps providing protections against wear or to offer better aesthetics. Presently offered there are a large variety of seat covers from leather to neoprene. More formal materials could be rented for occasions like for example weddings to improve the decor. Several seat covers have decorative seat ties or bows connected to be tied at the back of the seat in a ribbon or decorative knot. Various people use custom-made clear plastic furniture covers to protect their costly sofas and seats.

Seat pads are cushions intended for seats, usually decorative; they could even be utilized in vehicles to increase the drivers' height. Orthopaedic backrests provide support for the back, usually in lumbar or lower spine region. Several manufacturers have their seat pad designs patented and are recognized by some medical associations. Some of the new car seats obtainable are equipped together with built-in and adjustable lumbar supports so as to provide extra ease to riders and drivers of the motor vehicle.
